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




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Materials

1 Origami paper

Very thin and easy to fold, plain or patterned, origami paper is ideal to create small-sized jewelry.

2 Jewelry pliers

They allow you to open and close jump rings, to install ribbon clamps, cord clamps, and crimp beads.

3 Jewelry glue

This is a special glue that secures your origami piece on any metallic support.

4 Nylon thread

As it is almost invisible, nylon thread discreetly joins elements together.

5 Needle

It is useful to pierce your pieces in order to introduce a screw eye pin or a thread.

6 Earring hooks or posts

An earring hook or earring post (with stud or flat pad) will allow you to add a chain or a hoop to your models.

7 Finger rings with pads

The flat pad offers a wonderful surface to glue an origami piece.

8 Brooches

A brooch bar pin includes a pad on which you can glue your origami jewel. The loops of a brooch pin are perfect to attach dangling pieces.

9 Bobby pins with pads

You can create a hair accessory by gluing your model onto the pad of a bobby pin.

10 Jump rings

These come in a variety of sizes and can be used to link several elements.

11 Screw eye pins

A screw eye pin is used to attach a chain, cord, thread, or link.

12 Clasps

Added by using a jump ring, the clasp is usually the final piece to your jewelry.

13 Crimp pearls

A crimp pearl allows you to clamp two threads together or to secure your folded creation.

14 Chains

A chain comes in handy to hang your creation on an earring post or a brooch bar pin, or to join two elements together. It can also be the basis for a bracelet.

15 Ribbon or cord clamps

A ribbon or cord clamp is installed at the end of a ribbon or cord to add a clasp to a jewelry piece.

Add round pearls or sequins as finishing touches to your creations.

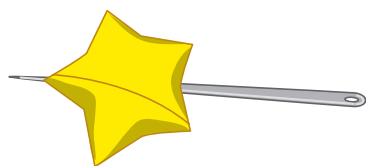
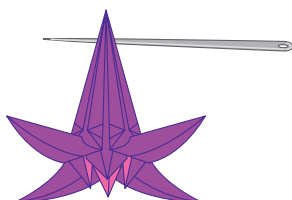
You can use varnish or vinyl glue to finish your models. Be careful not to use too much, or your piece will lose its shape.



Mounting Techniques

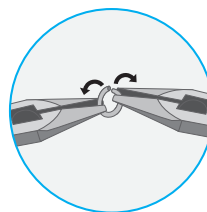
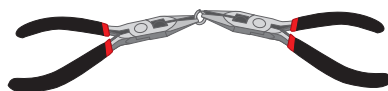
Piercing the origami

Use a needle to pierce your model, being careful not to puncture too close to the edge. For the stars, the needle enters between two branches and comes out at the tip of the opposite branch. That hole can also be used to insert a thread, a jump ring, or a screw eye pin.



Opening or closing a ring

Use two jewelry pliers to pull the ends of a ring in opposite directions. You can close the ring by applying the pliers in the opposite direction. Be careful not to bend the ring to the right or left, which would weaken or damage it!



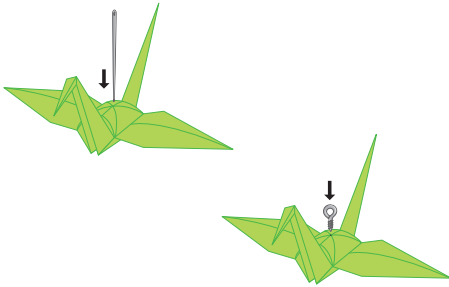
Installing a clasp

Open the jump ring, introduce the last link of the chain and the clasp loop, then close the jump ring, always using two jewelry pliers.



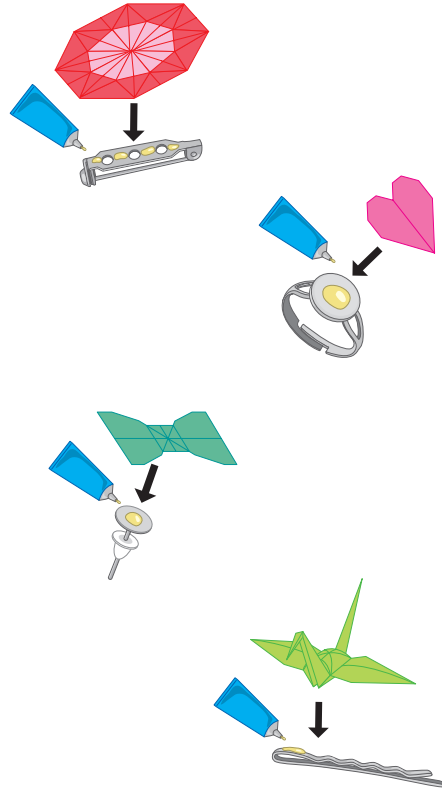
Installing a screw eye pin

Pierce your creation with a needle, and install the screw eye pin in the hole.



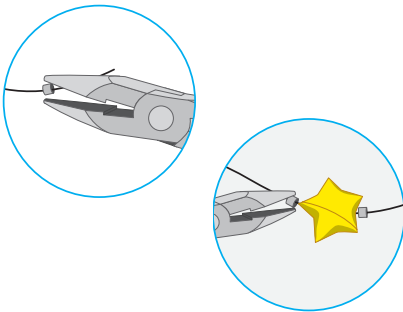
Finishing a brooch, a ring, a hair accessory, or an earring post

Apply a few drops of glue to the metallic pad. Then place the origami piece and apply some pressure for a few seconds. Leave it to dry.



Installing a crimp bead

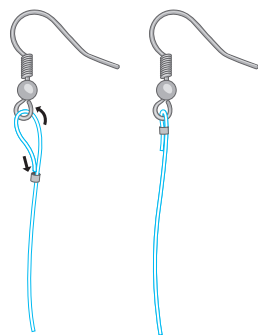
Thread a crimp bead and push it to the desired spot. Using jewelry pliers, crimp the bead on the thread to set it. After piercing your origami piece, thread another crimp bead and push it as close to the piece as possible so it will not move. Finally, crimp the bead with jewelry pliers.



Finishing an earring

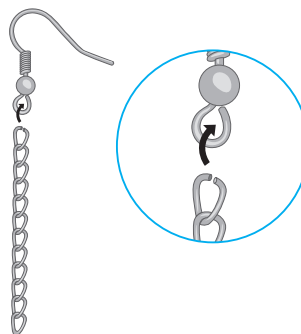
With nylon thread and a crimp bead

Thread a crimp bead onto the nylon thread. Insert the nylon thread into the loop of the earring and insert the thread back into the crimp bead. Adjust to the desired length, and crimp the bead with jewelry pliers.



With a chain

Open the first link of the chain, introduce it into the earring loop and close it. You can also join the chain to the earring with a jump ring.



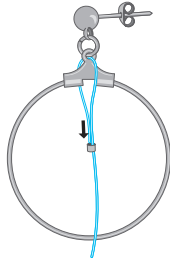
With a jump ring

Open the jump ring with two jewelry pliers. Slide it onto a screw eye pin loop already attached to your model (or directly into a hole punched in it) and attach to the earring loop.

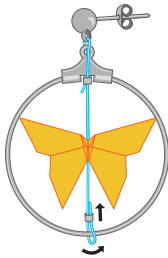


Finishing a hoop

1 Attach the hoop to the earring post loop with a jump ring. Next, thread the nylon thread through a crimp bead, push the thread into the loop of the hoop, and push the thread back into the crimp bead. Then, adjust to the desired length and crimp the crimp bead with jewelry pliers.

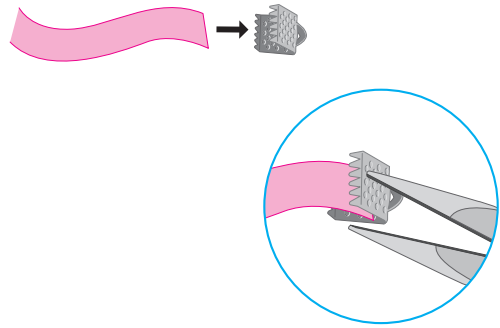


2 Thread the origami piece and a second crimp bead onto the nylon thread. Next, loop the nylon thread around the lower part of the hoop and insert it back into the crimp bead. Then, adjust the length, and crimp the bead with jewelry pliers. You can cut the extra thread if necessary.



Installing a ribbon clamp

Position the ribbon inside the ribbon clamp, and crimp it with jewelry pliers. Finish it by installing a jump ring on the ribbon clamp loop and attaching a clasp to it.



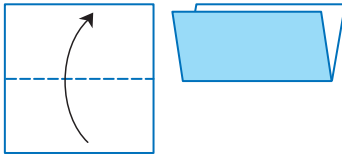
Installing a cord clamp

Position the cord inside the cord clamp before crimping it with jewelry pliers. Finish by installing a jump ring in the cord clamp loop and attaching a clasp to it.

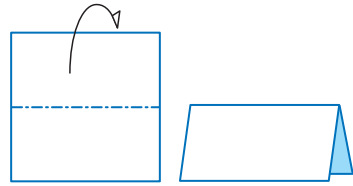

- 2 paper squares 2 1/4" x 2 1/4" (6 x 6 cm)
- 2 bobby pins with pads
- 2 pearls
- Patterned paper circles 1/2" (1.5 cm) in diameter
- Glue

- 2 paper squares 1 3/4" x 1 3/4" (4.5 x 4.5 cm)
- 2 earring hooks
- 2 earring hoops
- Nylon thread
- 2 crimp beads
- 2 sequins
- Glue

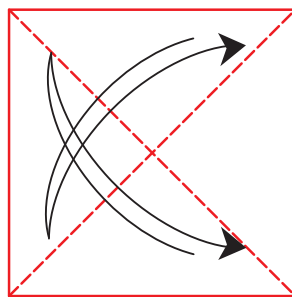

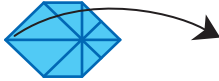


Cut two 4" (10 cm) pieces of ribbon. Insert the ends in a pearl, and make a knot to secure the pearl. Then, fold the ribbon and glue it on the pad of the bobby pin. Next, add a drop of glue to secure your origami bow on the bobby pin.

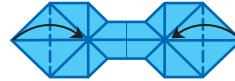

Necklace:

- 10 paper rectangles $1/4" \times 9 1/2"$ (0.7 x 24 cm)
- 1 paper rectangle $1/2" \times 23 1/2"$ (1.5 x 60 cm)
- Nylon thread
- 2 cord clamps
- 2 jump rings
- 22 crimp beads
- 1 clasp

Brooch:

- 6 paper rectangles $1/2" \times 11 3/4"$ (1 x 30 cm)
- 1 brooch bar pin
- Nylon thread
- 6 crimp beads
- 6 beads

Bracelet:

- 11 paper rectangles $1/2" \times 11 3/4"$ (1 x 30 cm)
- Nylon thread
- 12 crimp beads
- 2 cord clamps
- 2 jump rings
- 1 clasp

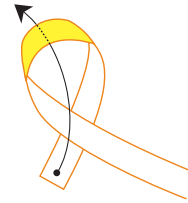
Earring with pearls:

- 6 paper rectangles $1/4" \times 9 1/2"$ (0.7 x 24 cm)
- 2 earring posts with hoops
- Nylon thread
- 8 crimp beads

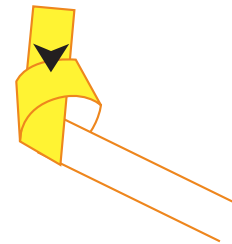

- 2 earring hoops
