

crazy and outrageous treatment of public and private property you have seen so fardamage documentary at it's best! Therefore I don't really need to note who is actually involved because you can expect all the



Well, this Graff Video shows it's possible and it can be done, it's probably just a matter of being crazy or not. While the intro drops va some nice live footage of what can be expected later on, the main movie is basicly splitted into two parts the commuter trains and the madrid metro! STOP - now don't skip the first part, just to see the Subway Styles, cause you would miss a lot of nice stuff, live bombing at night and in daytime which lets you witness the reaction of normal people, plus certain suicide backjump mission. Is there a better feeling to see a fresh ly painted train getting alive and into service? Note: this first part was probably just a warmup for the second one, the Madrid Metro Madness! Prepare for an exclusive visit to the subway tunnels and yards deep under the city of Madrid and virtually join up with local graff gangs to explore a new territory, the underworld of Spain's capital city! The Camera-man really tries to catch up with the atmosphere inside the tunnels and also films the surroundings of each spot and lav-up. This way you'll get a good insight of whats going on and how real writers do it! Especially enjoy that grazy episode of writers doing backjump pieces in an underground subway station including normal passengers sitting in the station and the subway itself, plus the Conductor

stepping out of his cabin, but cannot do anything against this ruthless attack of damage!

Before I'am telling you too much about the movie contents, I suggest you pick it up at your local dealer and enjoy it yourself. But take care and remember to set up a meeting with Ethan Hunt when you plan to visit Madrid!

Everything is a bit rougher and violent there, you might even be shocked by the senseless destruction of transit property including a train being set on fire.

Actually this movie is a perfect introduction for tourists planning a visit to Gdarsk City which is situated at the coast of poland and is easily accessable by train or boat. Prepare to take a lot of point with you cause the buff seems to be lazy over there and the PKP lost control over its train system to a certain gang called EWC which seems to be all city with a lot of strect-borning and a crazy amount of trains. If you like well-designed wild-style panels aswell as rough bombing styles, you'll definately enjoy this videol Prepare for a lot of live-actions, interviews with buffing crews and the vandal squad (unfortunately without subtitles...), madness destruction missions like mentioned above and a relaxed update of whats in service over there.



Let's talk about graff MINS from the MOAS v.s. interrailers

- BJ What do you think attracts the foreign writers to come to Copenhagen?
- M I think people come to Copenhagen because we got nice trains and a lot of toys live here; their doors are always open for the big boys and the fame.
- BJ How do you feel about it?
- M I dislike it because a lot of people just come here to do a lot of trains; fast silver, or fucked up one man whole cars, but we're the ones who have to do graff here for the rest off our lives. A lot of them never do real shit in their own countries, they do wack trains; no subways or the hardcore shit, it's easy to come to Copenhagen and hook up with a toy who's showing you the yards. That's what's happening here...
- BJ Can you give us some examples of actions you strongly dislike and why?
- M Yes, this summer a lot of french writers came here only to do whole cars. Why aren't they doing whole trains at home on their subways? I mean there are a lot of subway lines in Paris but you never see those people doing them!
- BJ Isn't it just a matter of taking it (the interrail wave) as it comes?
- M I can only give my comment on it because it's not going to stop. If people go to other cities to paint it's cool but do graff with your head and not with your dicks.
 - If I go to another city off course I want to paint, but it's not my main target. It's more fresh to chill with cool homies and if a do a piece I try to do a nice one instead of 10 ugly ones.
- BJ Do you think graffitimagazines are responsible for the interrailers movement that takes place every summer?
- M Nowadays people just go around looking for fame in magazines and movies while it's about doing graff with your hearts instead of looking for fame. A lot of graff today is about making money like graff-related clothbrands, graffmovies, graffcops, fatcaps and the list goes on..
- BJ What's the thing you hate the most about the situation in Copenhagen?
- M A lot of shit is done overhere but the most looked like shit, only a few good writers are left to do the hard work in Copenhagen. I mean people like Cave, Rens, Sabe, Pes and Rezen. This are the real deal peo-



A Norwegian trainbombers story

I woke up around 5 o'clock on saturday morning, turned on the tv and lighted up my "morning" cigaret and had some coke, there was only "snow" on the tv. I got a bit annoyed but what can you expect so early in the morning in norway? I took on my shirt and socks, started to "clean the room for evidence" and picked out the colors I wanted to use. Black for outlines, white for filling in the 3d highlights, orange for doodatts and pink for background. That should be the best color combination cause all the paint I had left was another pink!

After eating I was ready for action, I just felt like John Rambo in Rambo part 2 when he ties up his shoes; in other words I felt like a "real mean killing machine", except that I was only going to paint for 10 minutes, but, so what? Anyway, the time started to drip out so I had to hurry a bit.

15 Minutes later and a little colder I saw Phil on the buss stop. He pretended he'd lost some money under the bus so the driver had to wait for me! We're there, at the main place off our target. As far as we can see there are no undercover cops or quards, so we started to shake our paint heavily, cause as you might know felton eats shit if it's below 20 degrees outside. There it was, the subway. Phil walked up to see if the driver could be a problem, he wanted me to take a look, but since I stood on the side I only could see his back and I could see that Phil didn't want to be there for a long time so I said: he's cool, let's do this one. If we didn't we had to wait for half an hour till the next one came in.

Okay get the gloves and the masks on and

we're ready for action. We climbed down without making any noise, all the way to the 3rd car and started to paint.

Both Phil and I had a bad feeling about this so we stopped for one minute and suddenly we heard someone walking inside the car. We could see the driver was looking if some one was painting. We wanted to get finished so we sat down one more minute cause he was the type of driver we didn't wanna fight with; 1.90 mtrs. big and almost just as big over the shoulders.

We started again, finished the filins, doodatts, 3d and were just about to start the outlines... With a big 'kaaschmmokk' the doors opened. Phil and I were standing on each side of the door, and we each grabbed a can in case he wanted to fight, 'heeeey you little pricks, wat the fuck are you think you are doing?? Stop that now, at once!!! I'am going to call the police if you don't get the hell out off here!!! Then suddenly he grabbed a bottle and threw it after us. Phil got real angry and started to scream back: 'if you don't shut that fuckin' door, I'am going to kick your ass!!! That was plain stupid as the driver jumped down on the track and said: okay; come on! Oops! We both jumped over the fence, grabbed some rocks and threw them after him. We took pictures off the unfinished wagon and ran away! I went home and Phil went to his place, we needed some sleep. 12 O'clock the same morning. I met Phil on the same buss stop, but this time I was there first. Finally the bus showed up with a 20 minutes delay. On saturday there are so many cars on the roads even worse than in the

rush hours. Anyway, we went to the city again, and we took the subway to the paint store. There it was; 'the unfinished tht subway' That was strange, but at the same time funny. Normal when you get noticed the car runs straight out off service, but no: not this one. There on the subway station I felt like it was mend that the panel was part off the car! We went to the hardware store, straight to the painting department. We grabbed two black Quick spray cans, and putted only one up in the shelf again, with other words, we had been stealing! Anyway, we started to find out when the subway was supposed to be back on the end station, and we went up there again! 30 minutes later the car came in; with the same driver again. He stepped out off the car and walked around the platform enjoying the nice weather. We jumped down again and we got finished after all but when we started to take the pics he noticed us again! He ran between the cars and looked at us like he knew us and then said: 'oh no, not you guys again... don't you ever quit doing this stupid things?"

Phil said to him: 'Go fuck yourself! don't bother, it's not your job to annoy writers, it's the vandalquads work so go back to your job' and we ran away for the second time within a few hours. We were happy; we didn't wasted any paint, got the photo and didn't get caught; "mission completed"! Maybe it's easier to say: painted, ran,







Berlin's TrainBomberscrew

DRM DRM was founded in the summer of 1996. Some of us only got together because they were involved in Graffiti, and some others were good friends. Therefore DRM-CREW was founded by TOK, MARE and BOOM. The main thing was to create a group of good writers. But the most important paintsurface should be trains only. No matter whether Berlin or foreign railway-systems!!

DRM DRM-Crew consists of TOK, MARE, RUZD, RAGE, MICRO, AREA, SAM. Otherwise known as SPORT, ACE, FREAK, and DAVIS. DRM is a crew which is formed by stricktly Berlin writers. For us it's very important always to be in contact with each other. That's the reason why we are not interested in writers from other areas. Also the most crew members are friends for years. DestRoy-Masters is one of the wide varieties of meanings. You can call it Da Real Mad's, DReaMers or Deutsche Reichs Macht. Whatever you want!

DRM All DRM members are writers from the "Wild-West-Berlin".

Only 1 member is from the erazyeastside-Berlin".Living in Berlin is very exiting. But it is a pity that there are 2 much guys, armed with spray-cans, going into the yards and destroy them with ugly 2- or 5- minutes silver shit. You can't stop this development, because Berlin is a big city with a lot of yards and lay ups. So it's very difficult to keep a good view over this system. There are so much writers and everyone will do the same shit.

But what's really fucked up, is that Berlin is the city of the empire. So there are 2 much cops and strickter laws now. That's the reason why we often travel to other cities like: Stuttgart, Hamburg, Frankfurt, Munich and much more... Paris, Amsterdam, Rome, Prag Copenhagen are our european aims.

DRM You're right. But this status gets lost more and more. There isn't enough new blood with good qualities. The young guys often try to copy good pieces, but there are 2 many wrong examples. They only see line-pieces (today the most are ultrafast quickpieces), then they take a silver and a black and do the same. They've got no motivation to go outside and

paint some more lavish pieces. In the beginning we did the same (I think that's normal), but when time gets by the quality becomes higher as your own style developes. We'll see what's going to happen in the next years with da newjacks (your actual shit is wack).

shift is wack).
On the international aspect we'd like to say: Berlin burned it all, in both Style and Madness (Thanx to the Berlin Roots for showing us the way of the game and to some young terrorists like Mr.FREAK who sets the norm of trainbombing).

We also think that Berlin needs a lot of own Graffittimags because there are many guys with a swing like a king and they produce so much burners at walls and trains; that shit has to be publicated.

Overkill, True2the Game, Hard2Burn and Backjumps are the most famous of the Berlin magazines.

DRM In Berlin all kinds of trainlines exists. The S-trains (15 different lines), the Subway_(with 10 lines) and the Regional lines.

> Hitting trains in Berlin is connected with a lot of patience and perseverance. Sometimes you can check out from place 2 place and still none of them is possible to paint.

Security-guards in all yards and lay ups are the main reason for this situation. Only the fact that there are so many different places in town, makes bombing trains possible at least. The access to the trains isn't a real problem. Only some special places are saved with high fences. The subway is secured by the police and special subway guards. But nevertheless the subway is more bombed than the Strains. The most subway spots are in the underground. That's why they can't check this places all the time. But you can never be sure wether the cops didn't set a trap. You'll always have to keep your eyes open. For the most trainactions we're planing not more than 10 to 20minutes. Only sometimes there is the chance to stay longer (what depends on the

place we're going). But the biggest problem is the hard buff. 2 years ago the so called city program "ACTION-CLEAN-BERLIN" has started. There's a contract between the City Council and the Transport Services that trains covered with graffiti shouldn't be in traffic. In the last 2 years bombed train hasn't been in traffic more than 1 day!

DRM After the city was re-united a real flood of west-Berlin writers came to east-Berlin. The system got out of control at that time. It was very easy to paint in the east now because before the city was re-united there were only a few writers living in east-Berlin. And not all of them painted trains regularly. Nowadays the eastside yards are totally destroyed. But apart from that there aren't much differences between east-and west-Berlin.

DRM Yes, of course! But it's not so easy for guys from foreign areas to come up with some trainpaintings on their own. These guys often get chased by the guards or the cops. Okay; what the OMT-CREW has shown us was very enviable at that time. But what it was like in those days, is totally impossible today. You can't go into a Berlin S-train yard and paint 1 or 2 full color burner WC's. But you have a chance to paint a full color wholecar less then 3 times a year.

For us it's very important to paint our own local steel. But hard times makes traveling to other cities necessary.

- DRM Oh,we can't tell you the real reason for this. Maybe we're all totally insane?! Most people say it's only for the ultimate kick. Okay, at least that's not wrong, but for us it's more important to make a good piece in a short time. Normal people can't understand what we're doing. They can't recognize the creativity which is necessary for a good trainpiece. Hall of Fame pieces

- sometimes are very nice, too but that's not our mission!!!
- DRM Every writer's style is basically based on the old New York styles. New York was the foundation for us, that's clear! Some of us try 2 hold on the N.Y.-style but we also share the opinion that a personal style has to be developed too. It's important to see varied new styles with a little bit of originality and crazy swings. So it will be never boring!

- DRM Every crew-member has a different idea of the perfect style. In a discussion about style you can get into an argument for hours. But we all share the same opinion; painting a very good simple style is one of the hardest





- L. I'm totally okay with the word Graffitiwriter, since most of my jobs are spraypainted surfaces, that contain styles, It seems more and more clients are aware, of what they get and the typical combination of 3D letters, backgrounds and my characters is a good device for all these different jobs, I do. The only thing I'm really in, besides Graffiti, is my family.
- BJ How serious do you take graffiti, as a job, as a serious art, does your strive for perfection ever gets in your way?

Prime

For a couple of years there's been gossips about a Dutch tagger called PRIME. His name is on almost every train and that's why PRIME appears in the blackbooks of a lot of Dutch trainwriters simply by having tags on the pieced trains! Time for Bomber Magazine to talk with the notorious PRIME!

I started tagging in highschool when I was about 13. It started with the inside bombing of buses, I was influenced by AMASE from Den Haag and SCAGE from Leiden because both of them were bombing so much it made me want to do the same, SCAGE was bombing the insides of buses in my hometown. We were on the same high-school so we both drove the same buses and I started bombing too and much more. I enjoyed getting known in that way. Then when I got to university and got my free traincard. I moved bombing from the buses to the trains. Still SCAGE stayed a major influence as he pulls out pieces along the Dutch railway tracks all over Holland in a strategic way.

Now I'm a graduated business economic at a Dutch university, specialized in marketing. I visit a lot of big companies in Holland and talk to a lot of high-ranked managers. In a train I become another person, then I only wanna bomb the outside of the train. Then the "Mista Dobalinas" become enemies, because when they see me hanging outside a trainwindow they'll make remarks or even worse. When other people see me they don't care simply because they just don't understand. You only see them looking surprised. At the university I learned everything about "brand-strategy" and that is what PRIME is to me as we'll; just like a marketeer managing his brand, I manage my brand PRIME.

I've been writing PRIME since 1988 and the last 6 years I've been thankfully using the network of the Dutch railway to get "national coverage" (landelijke dekking) and it doesn't cost me billions of dollars like the mobile phone companies. Once again I confuse people when I write my PRIME tag on a train along with "landelijke dekking". I see people looking astonished and I ask myself what are these people thinking: "Is there another mobile network?" I just love to bomb, that's pure graffiti to me. I don't do pieces

because I?m not good at it. My motto is: "if you do something you have to do it right!" I wasn't satisfied with the pieces I made so I'm not doing that anymore. Bombing on the other hand that's something I'm good at. I try to do it strategically. On each train on both sides I have to do at least 2 PRIME tags. Sometimes people stare at

ly. On each train on both sides I have to do at least 2 PRIME tags. Sometimes people stare at me when I'm walking through the train from one side to the other and then later on it seems I have my face covered with ink. But that can happen when you're hanging out of a train window with a filled marker doing tags at a 140 km an hour. In a relative short period of time I gained a lot of "brand awareness" and that's what it's all about for me; getting up; it's marketing of myself but then for the underground. Sometimes I see PRIME tags crossed out, but it makes me laugh, jealousy is written all over it. Occasionally I run into faded PRIME tags that barely survived a couple of buffs. But that's the cool thing about the tags; the Dutch railway doesn't really clean them and the ink stays on the train even after a couple of buffs.

A couple of times I've been spotted by the driver of another train passing by while hanging out of the window tagging. They blown the horn that is so damn loud as it's so close that it almost gives me a heart attack! Another thing that happened is that I was doing tags hanging outside the window while driving through the Schipholtunnel. Thank god the train wasn't driving that fast A construction worker was standing

next to the track in the Schipholtunnel and I was hanging out the window really far and we almost clashed; I almost hit the guy, can you imagine?
