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
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

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

Pokras Lampas St. Petersburg, Russia

Odd characters envelope the nude model. The long strokes look like those belonging to Leonardo da Vinci had he lived further east. But it's not the cryptic code of the Renaissance Man but that of Russian calligraffiti writer Pokras Lampas.

Inspired by typographic visual masterpieces of Niels Shoe Meulman, Lampas started to write modern gothic calligraphy letters on the streets of Moscow. Then two years ago he started writing on girls.

"I was always was interested in

different kinds of handwriting: tags, calligraffiti, tattoo fonts and some kind of typography experiments," Lampas says. "Now I'm trying to achieve new rules, shapes, compositions and alphabets."

For those who aren't fluent in Lampas, that doesn't necessarily mean you don't get his art. "My works are really difficult to read, I'm (usually) writing quotes or song lyrics," he says. "For me it is really important to show a new vision of the modern composition and calligraphy style to inspire people. Often

comments (online) say, 'I can't read this, but this is so awesome!' I enjoy that calligraphy can be art for a lot of different people."

Other than nude women's skins, Lampas has marked subway cars in Russia, a soon-to-be revealed wall in France and the Baltic Sea. Yep, he wrote on the ice. His dreamscape? "Maybe calligraphy on a space shuttle." 

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




THIS NIGHTHAWK IS NOT JUST A GIGOLO

THIS NIGHTHAWK IS NOT JUST A GIGOLO

Nick Hawk is a gigolo. "Lucky guy," you say. Well, yes, but the dude has put in work. No man is born a gentleman-stud; his attitude, determination and positive outlook have molded him into the man that women pay to date.

Before the California girls started throwing money at him for his companionship he was just a kid working on a farm in Wisconsin. His work ethic made him excel in the high school sporting arena and then in college, but the humble hunk ran out of tuition funds. He joined the Air Force and used his time served to take advantage of the GI Bill and go back to school. He stripped to pay the bills and during his last year of schooling he founded Explicit Strippers which has since spread to Orange County, Los Angeles, Las Vegas, San Diego, Hawaii and Dallas. The hustler, with his prolific dating and overall life experiences, then made the jump from Magic Nick to male escort and has entertained countless dates and viewers of Showtime's Giaolos.

"When the show approached me I was breaking into acting and my manager, who is an agent, told me, 'You don't want to do reality or adult TV,'" Hawk says. Though Gigolos is the perfect storm of both, Hawk signed on. "The show really allowed me to be myself-this is who I am in my life and with clients, in any situation I don't pretend to be someone I'm not."

Because he wanted to accurately project himself on Showtime, before he started filming he got inked up. "I wanted tattoos my whole life so I started going to the tattoo shop once a week before taping," Hawk says. His main tattoo, located on a large percentage of my body, including his left arm, chest, and penis, "yes, on my penis" is a Symbiote. "It's an alien creature from comic books that attaches to you. The creature doesn't always have the best intentions; it brings out your dark side and makes you not care as much."

He thinks that his best tattoo is the dragon which was tattooed by Ink Master Joey Hamilton at Revolt Tattoos in Las Vegas.

As he has grown as a person so have his tattoos, including the addition of color. "When the show started I didn't know what direction my life was heading which is represented by the dark, dealing with the adult industry can take you to a dark place," Hawk says. "Tattoos should evolve with you and the color looks brighter so it serves as a metaphor for where I

He plans on getting 50 percent of his body tattooed so that he is a walking yin and yang. His next pieces are mantra tattooes such as "Love thy enemy," "Fight" and "I come in peace."

Speaking of coming, getting down to it, Hawk will only have sex with a client if they have a connection. "When we were younger, if you took a girl home and scored—you won," he says. "Now I don't have meaningless sex anymore."

His turn-ons are success, style and sexiness. "Being aroused isn't that big of a challenge as I am a very sexual person," Hawk says. "Just thinking about sex on the way to a client who I have a connection with turns me on. I like boobs and a warm vagina."

His money-maker is a money-maker, his line of sex toys featurea a dildo cast from his own dick.

"It is pretty cool to think that my molded penis is in some woman right now," Hawk says. "I think it would be funny to do a DP with my dildo and

As per his big tip with the ladies (other than stay the fuck off your phone during a date) is: Be your confident self. While that may be easy for the sex god who has written a book and is finishing up another while also wrapping up a rap album to say, he's right.

Hawk is a champion of the individual. "Myself and Gigolos have opened up society's view on sexual freedom, and I hope to also open people's views on tattoos, freedom of expression and individuality. I love how we're evolving, becoming a more open, independent society. We are being more creative in our lives and tattoos are not being negatively thought of but are being more accepted as expression."

Separating Hawk from his working life as a male companion you might wonder if he will ever settle down with one woman. "I am open to it," he says. "If I ever find that special woman she would have to be okay with what I do." So how long he will be in the business? "Forever, the other day I was talking to a 92 year-old gigolo."









"When can I take my shirt off?" says the adorable brunette with radiant eyes and an even brighter smile. We and the cute girl are in an elevator 10 floors above the streets of Manhattan where it is legal to be topless in public.

"A lot of people say that I am 'cute' which is funny to me because I do some of the nastiest hardcore things on camera," porn star Bonnie Rotten says. "When people describe me as cute it makes me laugh."

The girl has spiced up her body with tattooed sleeves, hand ink and will soon be #freeingthenipple and in turn exposing the spider web tattoos on her breasts but her voice, demeanor and visage are pure sugar.

"No matter how hard my appearance or my scenes are, people still look at me as the 22 year-old girl that I am, and see the innocence about me—I love that," Bonnie says. "I try very hard to escape the image of being just a hardcore tattooed girl, I want them to look at me and also see my personality."

Either the heavy New York City air has made its way into the elevator or tension (we're no prudes, yet we have never walked around our neighborhood with "Spider Tits" fully exposed) has made the atmosphere thicken but Bonnie's sharp wit and charm julienne it. "I want to eat a hot dog in front of the guy at a cart and see how he reacts," she says. "Oh, and I want to ride the subway. I have never been on a New York subway, I hear they have crabs, or is it rats?"

Bonnie has been getting a rise out of people for only a few years but has already propelled herself to the top of the adult industry, being named AVN Female Performer of the Year 2014. She was the first thoroughly inked woman to ever have been given the honor.

"There were only a few girls in porn before me, like Janine (Lindemulder) and Joanna Angel, who were heavily-tattooed and got embraced by the porn community," Bonnie says without the twinge of boasting, just stating fact. "Joanna is more on the alternative side and I have been embraced by the mainstream side of porn. I was the first heavily-tattooed girl who they were putting in movies with blondes who have big boobs and the brunettes with the big butts. I was not just categorized to be a tattooed girl who could only go into alternative porn, and that's really cool to me."

Breaking through that Lucite ceiling was something she was determined to do. "When I first started, the major companies weren't shooting tattooed girls," Bonnie says. "So I did the most-hardcore performances that I could take because I wanted to be cast in movies because of my performance, not my appearance."

Her look was cultivated early on. When she was 13 years-old she tattooed herself with a needle and India ink. "My grandparents saw it and said, No, you are a pretty girl, you need to get those fixed," Bonnie recounts. "So I got to have them sign off on my first tattoo. I chose the zombie on my stomach from *Night of the Living Dead: The Beginning, Issue 1* comic book. And once I was in the system and knew the guys at the tattoo shop I was able to go back and get a bunch."

Her body is covered in horror imagery and phrasing including the sternum piece "Dead Girls Don't Cry" from the psychobilly band Nekromantix, her zombiefied version of herself and "Camp Blud" across her knuckles in homage to *Friday the 13th*. Of course, there are also those spider webs woven onto her boobs.

"I did that when I was 17," Bonnie says. "I did regret it for a really long time, but after the past couple of years I realized that it has become a part of my identity. You are not going to find those on anyone else. It is the identification of Bonnie Rotten, they go, Oh the girl with the Spider Tits!"

The linework on the webs is good considering.... "Do you know how you are not supposed to get tattooed in anyone's house? I was never going to do that but it is the one time I











decided to do that with so I am thankful that I got lucky."

Other than being known as Spider Tits, Bonnie also is called "Squirt Woman" for her ability to ejaculate. "There is a girl who is a really big squirter in the business and she took me down that road," she says. "She taught me how to squirt and from there I harnessed that skill and kept getting better and better at it to became Squirt Woman."

"I think that you can train to do anything but squirting might be harder than most," Bonnie says of lay women learning porn stars' tricks. But she also admits, "A lot of the things that I have done on camera are not things that I have done in my personal life."

The sex in pornography, as with any creative endeavor, is always being pushed to extremes film after film. "There is always the hardcore sex scenes, with the doubles and the gangbangs and the DPs and all that, that is not the normal, everyday sex for a housewife but of course there is always something new that people are doing in porn," Bonnie says. "It will always evolve. At first it was just anal but people are going to incorporate enemas or balls up the ass or fruit up the ass. There is always a variation that people can add to make it freakier or a little bit different. Some days you walk onto set and they tell you that it is a milk enema movie. You say to yourself, Even though I have never done this, there is about to be milk up my ass. And you do it."

Bonnie is up for most anything and she is always in control. "People look at the industry and think that I am a victim or I was forced into this without circumstance," she laments. "I got my hands tattooed when I was 16 years-old and I don't have a GED so this career helped me grow to do other things now and in the future." She models for the mainstream, she directs porn (like the Sons of Anarchy parody, Sisters of Anarchy, "Doesn't everybody wonder what it would have been like to see Gemma get freaky?") and has a 14-piece line of sex toys. "I went to the shop and had all of my different parts molded, my face, my tits my ass, my pussy, so it was really cool to see the replications. They actually have my tattoos printed on them."

Her most-recent piece was tattooed by former Ink Master contestant "Gentle" Jay Blondel in the Inked office. He put a ringmaster on her right shoulder to compliment the bearded lady on her left shoulder. "It represents the fact that freaks can be beautiful," she says. "I am from a very conservative community in Ohio so when I had piercings and tattoos everybody looked at me like I was a freak of nature."

She is a long way from Hamilton, Ohio, her tattoos and her ta-tas are on full display in Times Square. The street is teaming with tourists, 1/3 oblivious, 1/3 pretending not to notice and 1/3 who are beaming brighter than the lights in the Toshiba sign. Police officers break into smiles, construction workers holler compliments and old women ask to squeeze her breasts. A few recognize her from her tattoos. All types have their phones out as her image gets uploaded to Twitter, Instagram and Snapchat. The Naked Cowboy gets dejected when the TMZ camera trains on her instead of him, the resident sex symbol of 42nd Street.

"All in all," Bonnie says, "my backpiece reminds me that you can be a freak in society but also beautiful too." N





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A CINDERELLA MAN STORY



He's got talent in the ring, on the ballroom dance floor, and now on the big screen. Jack-of-all-trades Victor Ortiz stars alongside Jake Gyllenhaal and 50 Cent in Southpaw-a boxing drama where Ortiz sunk into his role with ease since he was able to play a character not too far from his real-life self.

Inked: Did any of the cast members pick your brain and train with you?

Ortiz: The day I arrived, the first thing I asked was, "Can I please go see Jake [Gyllenhaal] train?" I needed to see what he was bringing. I was just curious to see all of that. I got to the training session and, no joke, the first thing that came out of my mouth was, "Whoa, he needs a lot of help right now." They were like, "What do you think, Vic?" And I said, "Well, first of all, that kind of move doesn't even exist."

Was it hard to hold back in the ring?

Every boxer can tell you the same thing. You can literally swing 110 miles per hour and stop within a millimeter from someone's nose. It took Jake some getting used to because I would come so close to hitting his face. And, at first, he wasn't really trusting me. So he'd flinch and close his eyes [laughs]. I'm like, "What are you doing?" and he's like "Dude, it looks so scary." I go, "Don't worry, bro. Please trust me, I'm not going to hit you."

You once had your last name tattooed on your back. Now it's evolved into a tribal piece. What's the story there?


When I was a kid, my parents actually abandoned us. Before that, there was one thing they were very strict of and it was, "No son of mine will ever have a tattoo or their ears pierced." The day comes when I get home to an empty household. Abandoned. It was just my brother, my sister and myself. So I said, "There's no one telling me what to do." So first thing I did, I got my ears pierced. Second thing I did, I went to one of my buddies. I was 13, and I asked him, "Hey bro, can you tattoo my back?" And he says, "What do you want?" I'm said, "I was thinking my last name on my back," and he says, "Oh, the ultimate Mexican way."

What sparked the change?

About four years ago, I found my dad for the first time. When I saw him I said, "Hey Dad, what's

up? It's Victor Jr." He says, "I know who you are." I was like, "Cool. Well, I don't know if you really know what I've done with my life, but I've done some really big things." And he says, "Yeah, I know what you've been up to." And then he says, "You know what gets me going? That tattoo on your back, that last name. That's my name. Don't you forget that." I said, "What? 

to headlining stages today. It's the story, in detail, that couldn't be told on the first album. "My relationship with my father, with my daughter, the difficulty of her not being two anymore and realizing her dad is gone. The things I deal with as a man by saying damn, am I doing this for the right reasons? To really provide for my kid, or because I was such a fucking loser growing up and I have this point to prove to the world? Am I doing this because I love the music or because I want to spite every person that said I wasn't one of the greatest to touch the microphone?"

That's not to say MGK's life is anything other than fantastic, relatively speaking. He's signed to Interscope and selling out shows, making money—the rock star he dreamed of becoming when he started this long climb. Also fantastic? Amber Rose, his new girlfriend, a woman as hard to pin down as him. On their first date, "we sat and listened to *Appetite for Destruction*, spazzing about guitar solos, and it clicked. I realized she's a badass. And things kicked off from there."

Holding court with a hip-hop princess like Rose is a nice leap from, as he tells it, "fucking girls for Adderall when I was 20," he says with a laugh. "My first album was fueled by Adderall. Straight up, there's plenty of girls out there right now like yo, Kells crashed on my couch for a night or two in college, stole half my bottle of Vyvanse and left in the middle of the night." For the record: The guy who annotated his own lyrics on Genius two years ago with "side note for the girls out there who think their men are 'fucking' them, you don't know what rough sex is like until I fuck you" hasn't grown up a bit in that department.

"I have no restraint," he says, as if anyone expected anything else. "If I'm in an Uber, or stepping outside for a smoke break, or at a dinner meeting, I will fuck on the spot. General Admission is his confession. Look into MGK's eyes and you'll see the gritty passion of a man who battled his share of demons to win that rock star lifestyle. "This album is a ticket to my life," he says. "See how similar we all are, man. We're all going through the same shit, seeing the same stuff." Maybe not the exact same; few guys get to date women like Amber Rose, or peer out at sold-out House of Blues audiences chanting along in time to your lyrics. But anyone who's sinned and repented, anyone who's been through a gauntlet, been pigeonholed and miscalculated—as Kells would say, "straight David and Goliath type shit"—can find something of themselves in MGK and his new album.

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

"How do I not poop while I'm having anal sex?' I giggle and squirm every time I have to answer that question. I don't ever think I'll be mature enough to get over that."


"If your body is telling you 'I want my boob to be grabbed,' then take their hand and put it on your boob. Follow what your body's telling you to do."



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FROM RUSSIA WITH INK: OLEG SHEPELENKO BRINGS HIS REALISM TATTOOS TO THE UNITED STATES.

Prayda means "truth" in Russian. No word describes Russian tattooer Oleg Shepelenko better, from his views on the industry to his realism tattoos that stay true to the subject (with the exception of the sugar skull mask he put on Vladmir Putin). Having travelled to the United States, the tattooer is leaving his mark on our local culture with dazzling pieces from portraits to animals. Before you book that backpiece you've been planning, check out this new kid from the Eastern Bloc.

INKED: What made you decide to teach yourself how to tattoo?

SHEPELENKO: When I was learning how to do tattoos there were very few famous artists in Russia to look up to. So I had to search the internet, books, and magazines for any information I could use to develop my skills.

You began tattooing in 2001 as a hobby, why did you make the switch to professional tattooer in 2005?

Over those first four years my work was improving so much that I began to receive offers to work in professional studios. My client list was constantly growing. The career pretty much developed itself.

How do you think being self-taught has helped your career? How do you think your career would be different if you had been mentored?

I believe that being self-taught I have come to work in my own style, free from the limitations that I would have had with mentors or teachers. I have often thought about learning from professional artists, but I'm always faced with the fact that they are restricted by rules. I think it's disheartening to have my art limited by these rules, so I decided to look at their work and implement some of what I saw in my own work.

What are the pros and cons of having been self taught vs having a formal apprenticeship?

I have no limitations on my style. The main disadvantage is that in order to succeed one would need to spend two- or even three-times longer learning. Going through trial and error and constant experimentation is important in order to find what works best for you-it is time-consuming.

Were you working towards being an artist that focused on realism, or was this something you came to love after dabbling in other styles?

I was always struck by the style of realism. And I purposefully tried to work on it and improve this style.

You work in realism, but you have said that you do not like doing fine details, why not?

Small details in the realism tend to change over a few years after the tattoo heals. I see, in some work, after a couple of years that noticeable details lose their sharpness. So now I have to constantly work to ensure that my tattoos don't lose the quality. This is my main focus when trying to master this style at the highest level.

Would you say that you prefer color to black-and-grey?

Yes. You can take the same color piece, give it to two talented artists, and receive two completely different tattoos. We, as individuals, based on our local environment, life experiences and so many more factors, interpret colors differently. Color helps to distinguish my work from the 1000s of other artists out there. Looking at black-and-grey, you see many of the same works resemble each other. It is much more difficult to make your black-andgrey unique and not like any other.

Which is more challenging and why?

Tattooing with color, in my opinion, is the most difficult because there are dozens of shades that need to be introduced under the skin without damaging it. It requires a lot of experience. For black-and-grey tattoos, things are a little different. This style is much faster and less traumatic. Therefore, almost every good studio has a wizard that does well in black- and-grey. And this is no surprise.

You look for inspiration in photography, do you ever photograph your own references?

Many of the portraits I do are of my own photos. I find it easier to take a good photo myself, rather than have to explain to the person what is required of the photograph. I have a set-up for professional photography in my studio.

> One of your more infamous tattoos is of Vladimir Putin painted up like a sugar skull. Putin is notorious for not taking well to being mocked, did you ever think there could be ramifications for the person who got the tattoo or possibly for you? My client came into the studio and asked for a Putin tattoo. The twist was he wanted it as unsual as possible because he collects a lot of unusual and sometimes funny tattoos. We did try our best not to offend Vladimir Putin and I do not believe this tattoo to be provocative or politically charged in any way.

What is the most unusual tattoo that you've done?

I would like to do more unusual, or unconventional, tattoos. Unfortunately my clients are increasingly turning to rather ordinary desires. But trust me, if I get to do an unusual tattoo, the Inked audience will be the first I tell.

Being self-taught, you spent hours redrawing portraits of people and animals, why have you now chosen to focus on one medium (tattooing)?

Initially I wanted to draw so that I would copy images and increase my skill level in tattooing. I'm not so interested in drawing on paper, to me it is better that the time gets spent on creating a beautiful tattoo on the skin. The more I work on the skin, the better I feel my level of tattooing gets.

What was your first tattoo?

First tattoo I got I was 17 years-old and it was a pattern on the shoulder. I had my friend, Alexander Haishyan, do it for me. It was very painful, but I

immediately realized that it was mine and I loved it.

Who do you want to be tattooed by?

I want a tattoo from Nikko Hurtado. I left a place for him on my leg. And on the other leg, a place for A.D. Pancho. We sometimes talk, but can never meet, because he and I are constantly working. Our schedules have yet to

You have quite a collection of tattoos, who have you been tattooed by?

I have tattoos from a lot of amazing artists. I view every single one of them as colleagues and friends. We meet, work together and build a friendship through hard work and a shared passion for the art. The most recent piece I've gotten was done by my friend Rich Zayas of Tattoo Lou's in New York. He did the Statue of Liberty on my neck to represent my love for New York.


You are currently working out of Tattoo Lou's in New York, any plans to make a move?

I am working towards being a part of the team at Tattoo Lou's. I appreciate being given the opportunity to be part of the World Famous Tattoo Ink Pro Team. The exposure I've gained since becoming a member has allowed me to get my work out of Russia. M













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YOU DON'T PROMOTE HAVING BEEN ON TELEVISION, IS THERE

A REASON WHY? I think that if I've learned anything from my boss, Victor Modafferi, it's that the work speaks for itself. You can have all the promotion in the world but not be a great artist. After I got the promotion from TV, I figured I did my one thing that I kind of needed to get a boost, but at this point I don't want to promote anything TV-related. I don't want to make people think that that's the reason people are coming to me. I want to prove that my work can be good enough to where I don't need a TV show. I prefer to do it my way and let the hard work and the art speak for itself.

YOU MOSTLY WORK IN BLACK AND GREY, WHAT MADE YOU DECIDE TO GO THAT ROUTE? When I first started tattooing I was heavily into color, but black-and-grey just sticks out to me a little bit more. It's a little classier; it blends into the skin a lot nicer. I feel that with realism you can accomplish way more with black-and-grey. I'd like to focus on one thing and have a specialty. I've seen that a lot of other artists have been really successful when they focus on the thing that they are good at and what they enjoy doing the most because that's when the best work comes out. When I do black-and-grey, it just feels right. It feels like what I'm supposed to be doing.

WHAT ARE YOU DOING TO MAKE YOUR WORK STAND OUT? Honestly, I'm just trying to get better everyday. I still have a lot to learn. I'm happy with the progression I've made the past couple of years, but I feel that I have more potential. I look at a tattoo and usually the client is pretty excited about it. They are enjoying it, but I don't get excited. I try not to hype myself up too much. I try to look at the imperfections in it and see what I can do next time to make it better.

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HAS YOUR MODELING CAREER HELPED YOU EXPAND AS AN ARTIST?

It is a double-ended sword; I have gotten a lot of following because of my past modeling, but at the same time it has taken a way from my credibility as an artist. I think this is the main reason why a few years ago I ended up quitting modeling and concentrating on tattooing and art.

WHAT ILLUSTRATORS HAVE INSPIRED YOUR WORK? There are a lot of artists that have been left unnamed: Artist during Medieval times, woodcut workers, carvers and illustrators—artists that unfortunately have not had their name carried on due to the lack of documentation. But to name a couple I would say Dore and Durer have definitely influenced me.

YOU RECENTLY STARTED DRAWING WITH DIGITAL MEDIA. This is merely a trial for me. I did a few illustrations using digital media, Wacom to be precise, but I do prefer hand-drawing much more, at least for now. Somehow I can't get the same results as I would by using basic pen and paper method.

WHAT DO YOU LISTEN TO WHILE YOU'RE TATTOOING? In the shop we often battle about the music. If it would be up to me it would most likely be some awful German techno goth tunes or nature-inspired terra ambient. Once I put on space ambient sounds for six hours, which was mainly telescopes beeping. It depends on the mood...but I do like my cheesy goth music.

WHAT DO YOU LOOK FOR IN A TATTOO ARTIST? Somebody who is passionate in what they do. When you enjoy the process of tattooing, the memory becomes precious. Sometimes its not as much about the end results than it is about the journey. Then again I have had a lot of people do their very first tattoos on me. I love the imperfections that my tattoos have.





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STEVE BUTCHER

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HOW DID YOU GET INTO TATTOOING? I'm self-taught and I started tattooing in 2011. I had a friend, who was tattooing at the time, see one of my paintings I was doing for art school and suggest I try tattooing. So I did. I played around at home for a year or so tattooing my friends and pretty much anyone who would let me tattoo them.

IF YOU HAD THE FREEDOM TO DO ANY TATTOO, WHAT WOULD IT BE?

That's a tough one. Anything NBA-themed, as I am a basketball nut. I like to tattoo things like comic characters, animals, movie portraits, real pop culture based imagery. As for placement and size, every tattooer would say pretty much the same good spots: forearm, inner bicep, side of lower leg, thighs, etc. But, if the customer's up for it, I like to do huge oversized stuff, full fronts and backs and shit. I feel they have somewhat of a wow factor.

WHERE DO YOU USUALLY FIND INSPIRATION? Pop culture is probably my biggest influence. I enjoy tattooing and painting, as do most artists. When I started tattooing the artists that inspired me were Dean Sacred, Erin Chance, Nikko Hurtado, Carlos Torres, Matt Jordan, and Mick Squires just to name a few. Now it's pretty much the same people as well as everyone else killing it like Benjamin Laukis, Dmitriy Samohin, Carlos Rojas, Seunghyun Jo—the list goes on and on! I get a lot of inspiration from watching what everyone else is producing and just wanting to push myself to get better.




















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
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
